

Race Commentary by Richard Countess Race Chair



MILT INGRAM TROPHY RACE

The 39th annual Milt Ingram Trophy race was held on July 22nd. Unfortunately the engine on our race committee boat SYMPHONY wouldn't start due to a dead starter battery and dead house batteries and I had to enlist help from Andy Fried. After transferring the crew and race equipment from SYMPHONY to Andy's Catalina 37.5 SWEET, we left the dock and skedaddled to the start line and got the first start off only 20 minutes late.

This race would normally have started at the Mandalay buoy, proceeded to Platform Grace and then Anacapa Island leaving them both to port, and then finished in Ventura harbor for a total distance of 42 nautical miles. However, with the weather forecast predicting light winds in the channel and almost non-existent wind behind Anacapa Island, I shortened the course to 20.6 nm by eliminating Anacapa Island. Vickie Brewer and Candy Lorensen provided their 28 foot power boat LAST DANCE as the safety boat for the beach cats. Vickie decided to finish the beach cats at oil platform Grace in the dying winds.

The first boat to finish was Dave Chase's Fast 42 UHAMBO with an elapsed time of 3 hours and 45.8 minutes for the 20.6 nm race. UHAMBO finished 40 minutes ahead of the next boat. UHAMBO scored a "Trifecta" with the first to finish perpetual trophy, the Spinnaker A Class perpetual trophy, and the Milt Ingram perpetual trophy for the boat with the lowest corrected time among all monohull boats. The first place winners in the other classes were Gary Swenson's Petersen 34 TONKA in the Spinnaker B class, Deke Klatt's J-24 JADED in the Spinnaker C class, Bill Gibbs' Scionning 47 catamaran WAHOO in the ORCA class, and Ricky Vazquez's Hobie 20 MM in the beach cat class. The last boat to finish was Randy Dickenson's C&C 41 MAHALO with an elapsed time of 7 hours and 27.1 minutes. The full race results are posed on PBYC's web site.

I would like to thank the following club members for their help with this race: Jeff Heath, Andy Fried, and John Pyle on the race committee boat; Vickie, Candy and Alex Verharen on the beach cat safety boat; Andy Fried, John Pyle, Richard Haller and friend Steve for finishing boats; Kappy Paulson for preparing food for the post-race festivities; Jim Girdlestone for prepared pre-mixed pitchers of Mai Tais for the bar; and Jeff Heath for bar tending. I would also like to thank Mike Hopper, Andy Killion and Graham Dawson who raced and then offered to help me finish boats because of being short-handed.

Tri-Point Ocean Race

The 43rd annual Tri-Point Ocean race is scheduled for August 12th. This race is the final race in PBYC's Island Series. The course for this race starts at the Mandalay buoy, and then rounds both platform Gina and Anacapa Island to starboard for a handicap distance of 34 nm. Trophies for all three races in the Island Series plus trophies for the Series will be awarded on Sunday August 13th following a breakfast that starts at 10 AM and costs \$10. We will hold a raffle and silent auction during the breakfast and trophy award presentation. A limited number of T-shirts for the Island Series will be available for purchase (\$20 for short sleeve; \$25 for long sleeve). 

CRUISE NEWS - ENSANADA

On the morning of June 29 at 5:45 AM we headed out of Ventura Harbor bound for Avalon. This was the start of a cruise with WSA of Santa Monica. The weeks leading up to this day had been busy with trying to get paperwork together for bringing the boat into Mexico for the first time. All boats over 30' require a TIP

(Temporary Import Permit). Bill of Sale, Documentation, and Mexican Insurance. The biggest problem was the TIP. In theory you can do this on line, but myself and others had problems. My boat is held in a trust, and there was no way to do this on line. We opted to take our chances and try to get our TIP after arrival in Mexico. If we failed then we would be kicked out of the country after a couple of days of our arrival. We spoke with the Marina office in Ensenada and they agreed to help us. Prior to that we furnished them with copies of all required documents, crew list, and copies of passports for all crewmembers. So now we were off on our great adventure.

Patti had been uncomfortable with the idea of doing the trip with just the two of us on the boat. But just prior to our departure one of the other captains lost a crew member and agreed to sail with us. We would rendezvous in Avalon.

So with jacklines set, we were on our way. We arrived in Avalon at 7 PM and managed to pick up a mooring for one night, with the hope we could secure it for another day in the morning. The afternoon of June 30th other two boats arrived and secured moorings. We had some shore time in Avalon before starting our next crossing on July 1st. This was the longest crossing, we left around 9 AM and arrived 23 hours later in Ensenada. Taking turns on watch we made in thru the night and arrived tired the following morning. Sunday was spent resting and walking into town for fish tacos.

July 7 we departed to Dana Point Harbor, for dining and to buy fuel. The next day we sailed to Catalina Island and picked up a mooring in the Hen Rock area. We had a pot luck dinner aboard *Sweet, and the following morning said goodbye* to our crew and the other boats who were returning to MDR. We sailed back to Ventura arriving with some daylight to spare.



CALIFORNIA BOATER CARD DON'T LEAVE SHORE WITHOUT IT

It's time to get your California Boater Card!

All operators of motorized boats will soon be required to carry this card while on state waters. (That includes your sailboat while operating under power.) Good news! You don't have to leave home to get it! Many organizations offer online courses that qualify you for a card. The California Department of Boating and Waterways maintains a list of safe boating courses approved by the National Association of State Boating Law Administrators and the state. Some of them are even free!!! How easy can it get? It's way better and easier than going to the DMV for your driver's license. Click the link below for more information.

The card is proof of successful completion of an approved safe boating course. The one-time fee for the card is \$10.

As of **January 1, 2023**, all operators of a motorized vessel on California waterways who are **50** years of age and younger are required to carry a lifetime California Boater Card. Each year after that the age limit increases by 5 years. **All boaters will be required to carry the card by 2025**. Shake out a reef and get yours now before the rush. Less than two years left!




